The goal is to build \$20 million in 20 years

This will be achieved by fundraising through:

- Mix of endowments of bequests and donor giving
- Corporate giving
- Workplace giving (payroll giving)
- Event partnerships (Cardinia Foundation as recipient/part recipient)

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

2023 has been a year of new beginnings, implementing and launching our new 5 year strategic plan aligning with the Cardinia Shire's Liveability Plan, we welcomed three new board members to the foundation and celebrated 20 years as a foundation.

At our 20th Anniversary event in September the foundation launched its partnership program, aimed at building a network of local businesses who will become champions to support the foundation in helping it grow for the future. Partnerships start from \$275 up to \$11,000. At December 2023 we have six Cornerstone partners, two foundation partners and four partners. The foundation has distributed \$45,252 over two grants, our Community Grant round in June 2023 and Christmas Grant 2023 assisting 15 local charities. We successfully implemented a new grant platform to help streamline the grant application process.

The Cardinia Shire has agreed to fund the employee cost for 5 years up to \$120,000 per annum to ensure the success of the foundation. Kara Norton-Jones is our current Executive Officer who began in May 2023. We are currently recruiting for the role of Fundraising and Partnerships Manager.

GRANTS 2023

Our grants program focuses on 6 key areas, Education, Heath and Wellbeing, Social Cohesion, The Environment, The Arts and Crisis Support.

The panel reviews the grants based on these key areas as well as the demographic location of the projects.

The majority of our grants are awarded to charities that hold a DGR1 status.

A few examples of grants given this year:

PROJECTS	DETAILS	OUTCOME
A Better Life for Foster Kids	\$10,000 grant to assist with suitcases for foster kids	Giving at least 128 kids basic essentials as they often are placed in care with no possessions
Pakenham Men's Shed	\$4,900 towards a specially constructed service trailer	The trailer will assist with deliveries and pick ups of supplies as well as be used for BBQ sales at events to raise funds.
ADRA	\$5,000 towards the community bus.	The ADRA bus services at least 45 families in Pakenham each Thursday night with fresh produce and crisis support packs
Follow Bless Collective	\$2,000 grant for hosting a community Christmas dinner	The project will serve 200 community members that are doing it tough or need social connection




